Later, by providing the necessary infrastructure to ensure that these roots are safe. As the needs of Israel changes, so do we. Over the past few years, we have broadened our network of Israeli charities with whom we collaborate. Together, we help identify where our support is needed most, currently focusing our efforts on the greatest needs in social and environmental infrastructure.

We also work with Canadian communities from coast to coast to bring Israel closer to home. We host events in your local area, teach children in their classrooms, bring in speakers on topics that matter to Canadian-Jews, and bring Canadians to Israel on missions.

For 50 years, we've built stronger communities throughout Israel, especially in the periphery. Protective shelters and classrooms offer crucial safety, with 15-60 seconds to reach a shelter. Centres for therapies like PTSD treatment, animal therapy, family support, and youth services provide vital mental support and wellbeing.

In response to the horrific attacks on October 7, we established the Israel Resilience Fund. By collaborating with our dedicated partners on the ground in Israel, we ensured that this critical aid would address the most pressing needs of the embattled communities, including ambulances, medical equipment, food supplies, temporary shelter, and psychological support.



Redefining on our role & impact for a post-Oct 7 Israel

Due to the October 7 attacks and the subsequent war, the needs in Israel are enormous, and the task is overwhelming. Israel is facing challenges in all areas: health (mental health and physical rehabilitation), education, social service, housing, employment, security, and more.

For our part, JNF Canada aims to raise \$20M-\$30M towards the rebuilding efforts, over the next 2-3 years. We have established a Resilience Committee to identify the greatest needs and where our donors' support can have the greatest impact. We will conduct research, learn from thought leaders and experts, and hear from Israelis themselves, about what they need most. When we look back on our decisions 20-30 years from now, we will proudly state that JNF Canada achieved something outstanding that helped people and families, and the country's overall resilience, in the aftermath of Oct 7.

For this singular period in Israel's history, we need to move away from donor-driven projects to a laser sharp focus on the rebuilding and resilience projects that will best benefit Israelis now and for the years to come. This is a huge cultural change as we pride ourselves on being donor directed, but as this is an emergency, we need to act in a different manner, based on research and data, with a priority given to what Israelis need most.



In 2021, JNF's national staff and executive committee developed a bold, new 7-year vision. The Financial Resource Development (FRD) Plan outlines how JNF Canada will achieve new milestones by 2028. You can read this in our 2022 Impact Report. We continue to work towards these strategic goals while also re-aligning our work to address the greatest needs in Israel.

Rejuvenate the Segev Forest

In keeping with the tradition of Tu Bi'Shevat (The New Year of Trees), the annual campaign also fundraised for the rejuvenation of the Segev Forest. For 70 years, the Segev Forest has provided the shade of trees, unique flowers and wildlife, walking and cycling trails, and incredible archaeological sites in the Lower Galilee. Residents from all backgrounds – Jewish, Arab, Bedouin, and more – have shared these trails, gathered for picnics, and admired the vistas of the Akko Valley. The Bervin House will be a key institution for Sderot's next generation of leaders.





Tennis & Education Centre for Sderot and Gaza Envelope

Israeli Tennis and Education Centres teach children so much more than just tennis. ITEC runs many programs, with diverse focuses like integrating children from diverse backgrounds (religious, ethnic, socio-economic), empowerment programs for girls, welcoming newcomers, special needs classes, and more. Tennis brings the children to the centre and the education programs offered ensure that they have a bright future ahead.

School for Children with Special Needs

• • • • • • •

The Hadar School provides education and care for children with special needs in the Gaza area. The school welcomes children with autism and other physical and cognitive disabilities. It also relieves the burden on parents as primary caregivers, so they can maintain a regular income, and support other family members. The Hadar School operates 5 days a week, serves 3 meals a day and provides before and after-school care. It currently can accommodate 38 students but with JNF Canada's funding, the current renovation will more than double the Hadar school's capacity, to serve more than 80 students.

Sheltered Education Room

During times of escalation, schools are often forced to close. 
