We are delighted to publish another edition of ROOTS magazine. Within these pages we share the current and evolving charitable initiatives and programs that JNF has launched this year in Israel, made possible by your generosity and partnership. Thanks to your continued support, our Canadian Jewish community is united from coast to coast with common purpose, ensuring a brighter future for the people of Israel.

This year, JNF funds enhanced both natural and man-made environments in the Jewish state. In Kiryat Shemonah's Airplane Park, residents will soon enjoy a new recreation area, as well as a rehabilitated stream and green space. At the Martyr's Forest, commemorating the six million Jews extinguished in the Holocaust, we are building new visitor amenities and a welcome area. At Retorno, a social services organization in Givat Shemesh, JNF dollars helped build a lecture hall and bomb shelter for Israelis suffering from addiction. We also directed funds to an animal-assisted therapy centre for the children of Sderot, who are struggling in the wake of missile attacks on their city.

Numerous JNF projects in 2019 expanded and improved medical and wellness infrastructure. We supported a PTSD and Mental Health Centre at the Herzog Medical Centre, a pediatric surgical wing for Save a Child's Heart, and a physiotherapy and hydrotherapy wing at Beit Halochem in Ashdod.

JNF continues to put your donations to best use in Israel's thriving and innovative High Tech industry. At Tel Aviv University, we are helping to construct a nanoscience building. In the Arava, we are subsidizing a research and development lab that will explore how desert plants can be utilized in medicines for illnesses like ALS and Alzheimer's. In Sderot, we are taking the lead in a transformative Canadian national project-- a Beit KKL-JNF Canada House where high school students can receive afterschool enrichment in science, technology, math, and engineering, at no cost. These extra-curricular programs will enable Israeli youth living on the periphery to benefit from the same access to higher education as their counterparts in the centre of the country. We are excited by this opportunity to uplift and inspire the children of Sderot, who have faced adversity with such courage. You can support the Beit KKL-JNF Canada House project by completing the enclosed pledge form.

Another year slips by, and the High Holidays are upon us. We are thankful for your sustained contributions to our charitable projects, and hope that you are buoyed by the remarkable impact of JNF in our beloved Israel.



#### You are helping JNF build a facility for PTSD and Mental Health

According to the World Health Organization, one in four people in the world will be affected by mental illness at some point in their lives. Many of us know family members and loved ones who struggle with mental illness on a daily basis. Many of us take part in iniatives to break the stigma surrounding mental illness. Israelis are no exception. And JNF Canada knows how important it is to provide mental health care to as many people as possible.

JNF is collaborating with the Herzog Medical Centre and the Israel Centre for the Treatment of Psychotrauma, which is internationally recognized for its substantial expertise in treating posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

PTSD can be brought on by a wide spectrum of traumatic experiences including natural disasters, domestic violence, sexual assault, and school bullying, as well as war and terrorism. The facility will house medical services specializing in psychological trauma and other mental health issues for people of all ages, education, income levels, and ethnic and religious backgrounds.

#### Glassman Centre under construction

Currently, services are provided in an outdated facility which cannot support the number of people who require attention.

With your support, JNF Canada is building the Max and Gianna Glassman PTSD and Health Centre, which will include state-of-the-art treatment rooms to provide patients with an improved opportunity to access a range of crucial services, treatments, and supportive services. ۲

#### You are helping JNF build a Nanoscience and Nanotechnology Centre

JNF Canada is proud to support the development of Tel Aviv University's Abramovich Building for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology's second floor.

At just over 1,000 square meters in size, the floor will be home to seven laboratories and seven offices, including the Laboratory for Personalized Nanomedicine.

This building will galvanize TAU's nano research community, reinforce multidisciplinary research and technological innovation, intensify scientific collaboration and create new connections between the scientific world and society at large.

This project is about more than giving back to Israel. Together, we are working for the betterment of all of humanity.

#### You are helping JNF build Educational Facilities

According to Israeli government statistics, there are approximately 300,000 Israelis who abuse drugs. There are a number of organizations to treat those who become addicted, but Retorno, located in Givat Shemesh, is one of the very few dedicated to both addiction prevention and treating the mental health issues that so often accompany addiction.

Retorno has successfully put shattered lives together, as well as prevented addiction from taking hold in the first place. It has become a leader in the treatment, rehabilitation, and recovery from substance abuse, and the mental health challenges that can lead to addiction. Retorno runs multiple programs, including an adult residential program, Mifgashim, an outpatient centre, and Elah, their detox program for young women.

Through seminars and workshops, every year, more than 25,000 people attend Retorno's prevention programs. The seminars and programs educate and empower youth, adults, community leaders, schools, corporations, families, rabbinic delegations, and other groups.

In the last 10 years, Retorno has touched the lives of more than 200,000 individuals, their families, and their communities.

JNF Canada's large new lecture hall, which also serves as a bomb shelter, will greatly enhance Retorno's


#### You are helping JNF build a **Phsyiotherapy Centre**

While we celebrate Israel's remarkable achievements, we must also acknowledge the men and women whose lives have been devastated while defending the country. Unfortunately, through many wars and numerous ongoing acts of terror, the number of disabled Israelis continues to increase.


Beit Halochem provides Israel's wounded veterans and victims of terror with the opportunity to regain the

dignity and quality of life they deserve. Beit Halochem centers serve as a place of comfort where members feel supported and are not alone in their daily struggle to rehabilitate and reintegrate into society. After they leave the hospital, Beit Halochem is there to help them rebuild their lives.

JNF Canada is assisting in the construction of a wing dedicated to services including physiotherapy and



hydrotherapy. Beit Halochem Ashdod is the 5th and newest center being built and JNF is proud to help fund this wing as it will serve almost 7,000 injured individuals who are living in that region of the country. Together with their families, more than 15,000 people will benefit from access to this state of the art facility.





#### You are helping JNF build the periphery of Israel at **Airplane Park**

Airplane Park is becoming a green gem of nature in the Etzbah Hagalil region. A neglected cement canal is being transformed into a beautiful urban nature park near Kiryat Shmona, which is situated less than four kilometers away from the Lebanese border. The park will serve as a green lung for local residents and will attract visitors from all over Israel who will come to enjoy this beautiful space and the vistas of Nahal Iyun. The park will attract new residents and tourists, which will bolster the local economy.

Local residents call this region "Airplane Park", because an old abandoned airplane was parked there in the past. The airplane was moved to another site years ago, but the name remained. Development plans include a promenade along the Nahal Iyun stream, small bridges, wading pools, hiking trails, bicycling paths, observation points, sitting corners, picnic facilities, gardening and lighting.



#### Besides the importance of the

park for local residents and visitors, this project will also make an important contribution to the environment. We are removing waste that accumulated at the site, rehabilitating wetland habitats, creating an ecosystem and restoring the stream. We are actually bringing life back to this neglected stream.

#### You are helping JNF build a more beautiful Israel at The Martyrs' Forest

The Martyrs' Forest, which extends on both sides of the Kesalon River in the Jerusalem Hills, was established in 1951. The forest is a silent, powerful and natural memorial to the millions of Jews who perished in the Holocaust. In the forest stand six million trees – one for every Jew who was killed – a living, breathing memorial to the people whose lives were brutally cut short.

At its heart stands the famed "Scrolls of Fire" memorial created by the wellknown sculptor, Nathan Rapaport, chronicling the events of the Holocaust and the revival of the State of Israel.

In the forest stands a memorial to Anne Frank, who perhaps more than anyone else, represents the horrors of the Holocaust for many people. The Anne Frank Memorial was inaugurated in the Martyrs' Forest on May 2, 2011, on Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Day. Every year on Holocaust Memorial Day a ceremony is held in the forest.

This beautiful forest is carpeted with colourful wildflowers according to season and provides shady tranquility in summer. With your support, JNF Canada will help develop and renew the park for visitors and residents to continue to tell the heroic story of those who perished in the Holocaust.

#### You are helping JNF support **Animal Assisted Therapy**

For years, the city of Sderot has endured rocket and mortar attacks from Gaza. In cooperation with the Sderot Municipality, JNF Canada is establishing an extensive therapeutic courtyard at the Sderot Animal-Assisted Therapy Centre.

The expansion of the centre will benefit the residents of Sderot and those living in the surrounding area who suffer from trauma related disorders due to ongoing rocket attacks.

Alon Davidi, Mayor of Sderot, recently visited Canada to speak about life in Sderot. The people of Sderot live under constant threat of rocket attacks. Mayor Davidi is passionate about helping his residents, especially children, cope with terror, live a normal life, and prosper.

To explain the importance and success of Animal-Assisted Therapy, Mayor Davidi told us about his 7-year-old daughter Emunah.

Many adults and, especially children, feel the effects of a 15-second alert to find shelter. Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is not uncommon in children. Emunah, like many children in Sderot, would want to sleep with her parents, was nervous to go outside, and would freeze at the sound of the Code Red Alert.

Emunah visited the centre and spent a year receiving treatment. She didn't even realize it was therapy, she only believed that she was working with animals. And at the end of the year, she adopted her therapy dog. Recently, when 500 rockets were launched into Israel from Gaza, Emunah grabbed her dog and took him to the nearest bomb shelter. She no longer froze when the Code Red Alert went off. Emunah is just one example of your donations at work.

JNF Canada has committed to help support the construction of the new Animal-Assisted Therapy Centre in Sderot to assist over 1,100 children in the city living with PTSD.

For us, this is personal. For us, these are our friends, our family. These are real people with real stories.

**Children suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) who have** trouble showing their feelings sometimes find it easier to express themselves through animals. Instead of admitting I'm frightened when the alert sounds, they'll prefer to say the rabbit's really scared. Our current centre is small and cramped, and the new place will enable us to provide better service for larger numbers of children.

#### You are helping JNF Care for Sick Children

Save a Child's Heart has miraculously saved 5000 little patient lives since its inception. More miraculous is that the organization has thrived, even though it has been situated within the Wolfson Medical Centre in Holon, Israel, established in 1980. While equipment has been regularly upgraded to maintain the quality of care, there has been no upgrade or expansion of WMC's original facility since it was first built. In addition to the old infrastructure, there has never been a children's hospital or pediatric facility. The result is that the various pediatric departments and wards are spread through the hospital, often far-removed from each other, and

essentially mingled with nonpediatric facilities. Currently, the pediatric heart surgeries are performed in one dedicated operating room within Wolfson Medical Centre's sole general operating suite, which must suffice for the 200-250 pediatric cardiac surgeries performed there each year.

Wolfson Medical Centre and Save a Child's Heart Israel, with the support of JNF and generous donors as well, have undertaken to build the new Children's Hospital, which will be a five-floor building and upon completion will incorporate in a single, state of the art, childfriendly and dedicated facility all of the various pediatric wards, units and services currently spread throughout Wolfson Medical Centre. The Children's Hospital will serve both Wolfson Medical Centre local pediatric catchment population as well as the ongoing patient flow of Save a Child's Heart patients, which is expected to increase following completion.

JNF Canada will help build a separate and distinct functional unit of the Children's Hospital. The project will include three operating rooms, one for general pediatric surgery, one for pediatric heart surgery, and a state of the art hybrid operating room which will enable both open heart surgery and catheterization procedures to be carried out in the same gallery. Pre and postoperating care sub-units will be built as well.

What impresses us the most about JNF's work in Israel is the sheer breadth and scope of the projects JNF undertakes. These projects have impact across all aspects of Israeli lives, from nourishing the land itself to nourishing the well-being of its people.

Partner with us this high holiday season to help build the Beit KKL-JNF Canada House in Sderot, as we aim to close the educational achievement gap and foster academic success and empower periphery youth.

"We believe that every child has the potential to achieve great things no matter where in Israel he or she was born, and that our role is to make the resources required for this available to them," said Avi Musan, KKL-JNF Houses Director. "The houses will be open to every teenager who wants to succeed, and we will provide them with all assistance so that they can develop their capabilities. This is a one-of-akind anchor that is unparalleled in the State of Israel."

The Beit KKL-JNF Canada House in Sderot, the city closest to the Gaza border, will first and foremost serve as an after school, informal education, empowerment, and enrichment center for high school youth from Sderot and its surroundings, who will be provided with the necessary tools and skills for academic success in science, technology, engineering and math.

The building will be fortified, protecting students and staff from rocket and mortar attacks and will also be accessible to people with



disabilities. Its design will be invitingly clean and bright, with large windows to let in natural light, colorful wall illustrations, and open spaces, creating an environment and ambiance unlike that of a school.

The Beit KKL-JNF Canada House will be surrounded by a courtyard for outdoor studies and comprised of learning spaces of different sizes and relaxation areas equipped with a variety of educational and multimedia resources to encourage creative learning based on the edutainment model of informal education. The House will be divided into classrooms, a multipurpose hall, meeting room, patio, kitchenette and a unique experiential learning hub. The classrooms are designed to contain small learning groups, except for one large classroom (that can be divided into two), and a computer lab with the latest equipment. The multipurpose hall will be used for workshops, lectures, performances and film screenings. The hub is an open space with armchairs, sofas, and video game consoles to faciltate community building.



The story of our honourees starts in Moldova, a small Soviet state between Ukraine and Romania. Moldova, where Yves and Luba were raised, lost much of the Jewish population in the pogroms of 1905, WWII, and during the breakup of the Soviet Union. Reacting to growing anti-Semitism, Yves and his family left Moldova to settle in Canada and Luba's family made Aliyah to Israel. After a whirlwind adventure, Yves and Luba found one another again and Luba joined Yves in Canada. Never forgetting where they came from, and never taking their freedom for granted, they made their home in Hamilton. They have become pillars of the Jewish community and role models for their outstanding philanthropy and volunteering.



#### JNFU: A PERSONAL STORY SEEING ISRAEL THE JNF CANADA WAY: MY EUROVISION MISSION EXPERIENCE

I was born and raised in Ottawa, and have always wanted to be able to do more for the Ottawa Jewish Community, but never really knew where to start. Last winter I went to a JNF event to hear Noam Gershony speak about his life as an IDF pilot who was injured during the 2006 Lebanon War and went on to become a Paralympic Gold Medalist in Wheelchair Tennis. His words gave me perspective and made me realize that even though I am just a 22-year-old Carleton University student, I can really make a difference in my city and in my community. A few months later I jumped at the chance to begin making a difference by joining the JNF Canada Young Leadership Mission to to see Israel the JNF way and to experience many JNF projects first-hand with participants from all over the world – Italy, Mexico, Sweden, Ireland and Australia.

The trip included important visits to the Western Wall, Mount Herzel, and Yad Vashem. We visited — and bought lots of delicious food — at the Shuk Carmel. We said Kabbalat **38** Shabbat on the beach at sunset. We visited the gorgeous Saad Kibbutz which was 4 kilometers away from the Gaza Border. We experienced Israeli technology advancement at the Peres Center for Peace and Innovation. We took a very long bike trip along the Agamon Hefer and Alexander River. We experienced a real Druze meal and their hospitality. We took part in "White Night" in Tel Aviv, a city that doesn't stop. In Nazareth we toured the Beit KKL/JNF House and met some of the students. Many of the classes they offer are so advanced that Canadians engage in these subjects only in university. It is an amazing space for students, especially those with learning disabilities, because they learn at their own pace. And, of course, we got to experience Eurovision in Israel!

I will never forget these experiences. But truly, it was seeing the wonderful JNF projects first-hand that really inspired me. I cannot wait to bring JNF to the Jewish community of Ottawa for events and fundraisers. I could not have asked for a better JNFU Israel experience!
