We are delighted to share this edition of ROOTS magazine with you. As a supporter of JNF Canada, we want you to be well informed about the impact of your donations in Israel. Thanks to thousands of people like you from coast to coast, we are coming together in common purpose to touch the lives of Israelis, in every corner of the country representing every demographic group. Together with you, JNF Canada is building the foundations for Israel's future.

This past year has been challenging one. We were not able to host in person events, educate kids in schools and youth groups, organize Israel missions, or come together for the annual Negev Dinner/Gala. Nevertheless, we continued our important fundraising work through direct mail, calls, digital marketing, and online events. Thanks to the wonders of technology, we were able to reach thousands of people during the year. We held virtual galas and honoured inspiring community leaders. Our educational emissary organized over 100 programs including dozens of virtual visits to Israel. We hosted online workshops where participants learned how to taste Israeli wine, cook delicious food, appreciate the environment, and more. JNF continued to connect Canadians with Israel through meetings with Israeli scientists, elected officials, thought leaders, and artists. And yet, with all of these online successes, we can't wait to see you again in person.

We have introduced several exciting new initiatives this past year. JNF Toronto launched the Builders Circle, which helps donors find the right project for them and to

make their mark in Israel. We have a project for every interest and cause, categorized by topic, location, and giving level. We are thrilled to announce that within 6 months, many new "Builders" have collectively pledged almost \$4 million. We are rolling out the Builders Circle across this country this fall, and we encourage you to join us and become a builder. As well, JNF Quebec launched an exciting new project, the Climate Solutions Prize. CSP brings our historic roots as an environmental organization forward to the next generation of environmental work: funding new technology for climate change solutions. JNF will award a \$1 million prize annually (the largest prize of its kind) to researchers from Israel's top universities, institutes, R&D centres and more. Countless surveys reveal that climate change is the most important issue to the younger age groups, and we are hopeful that the Climate Solutions Prize will deepen the connection of the Next Generation to JNF's work. Together, we can do something profound to help both Israel and the global environment

You can be proud that a number of projects came to fruition over the past year. JNF Canada's largest project to date, the Glassman PTSD and Health Centre at the Herzog Medical Centre was completed. The Animal Assisted Therapy Centre serving the children of Sderot is open (with so many children in need of therapy, it's already at capacity). In the educational kitchen at the Dekalim School in Be'er Sheva, special needs students are now receiving vocational training in order to find employment in the hospitality industry. We are thrilled that

we will host the ground-breaking for the Bervin JNF Canada House in Sderot in late September. This is a JNF Canada national project and every region participated in the fundraising efforts over the past 2 years. We are currently at 90% of our fundraising goal - it is not too late to join us in completing this project.

We experienced a very difficult time in May surrounding the conflict with Gaza. It was devastating to watch over 4,000 rockets launched at civilian targets. It was equally chilling to see the spike in antisemitism on social media and around the world. In Canada, Jews were attacked verbally and physically. It was so shocking and disturbing, JNF Canada stood up in same manner as we have for decades - we raised money to help where it was needed most. We turned to you for donations for the Resilience Centre in Sderot, where individuals and families struggling with PTSD and other mental health issues caused by the incessant rocket fire can access services and care. Thank you to the hundreds of donors who supported the Resilience Centre.

The High Holidays are arriving earlier than usual this year, so it is hard to believe that with Labour Day, we start a new Jewish year. We are thankful for your sustained contributions to our charitable projects and hope that you will be buoyed by the remarkable impact of your donations in our beloved Israel.

REMEMBERING JOSEPH LEBOVIC z"I

JNF Canada mourns the loss of Joseph Lebovic O.C., C.M., Ph.D. who passed away at the age of 91.

Born in Czechoslovakia, the family moved to Hungary before the Second World War. He survived the Shoah and emigrated to England and in 1949, arrived in Canada with his father and brother, Wolf. Joseph became a community builder in every sense of the term. Through Lebovic Enterprises, the family built homes, condominiums, and neighbourhoods. As well, the Lebovic family invested their charitable resources with many organizations serving the general community, the Jewish community and Israel. Joseph and Wolf's donations to health care, education, social service and more were transformative to the institutions they supported and had a deep impact upon countless lives.

Joseph has supported JNF Canada for decades. JNF paid tribute to Wolf and him in 2005 as the Negev Dinner

Honourees. This is the highest honour that JNF bestows upon an individual for their leadership, generosity, and community involvement. JNF Canada has dedicated numerous projects in Joseph's name including the Lakhish Reservoir and the Jerusalem - Tel Aviv Bike Path. Joseph and Wolf were one of the lead donors in the establishment of the Stephen Harper Visitor and Education Centre in the Hula Valley. Joseph visited Israel with JNF in November 2019 to attend the dedication of this new Centre. Joseph and Wolf's lifetime giving established them as the most generous donors in the history of JNF Canada.

"On behalf of the board and staff of JNF Canada, I extend our deepest condolences to the entire Lebovic family. We were very proud to have Joseph as a member of our board of directors. He will be sorely missed," said Beth Price, President of JNF Canada.

"Joe has been a great friend to JNF for so many years. I am very grateful for the advice and guidance he provided me as well as his tremendous generosity. On his last trip to Israel in November 2019, we spoke about his love for the country and the people of Israel. At the dinner in advance of the inauguration of the Harper Centre, he told me that Israel was at the core of his being. He was so proud of his lifetime support of dozens of charities and institutions that built and sustained the country. It was evident that Joe bled blue and white. He really opened up to me and it was quite moving," said Lance Davis, CEO of JNF Canada.

JNF Canada will dedicate our 2021 national project in memory of Joseph Lebovic. JNF Canada is renovating a seniors centre in Rehovot that services mainly Holocaust survivors so that they can enjoy their golden years in a beautiful and comfortable facility. We are proud to link Joe's good name to a beautiful project in Israel. May his memory be a blessing.

THE DR. MAX z" & GIANNA GLASSMAN PTSD & HEALTH CENTRE

With an endless list of causes in Israel to support, we are often asked, "Why donate to JNF?"

Here's a short story that shows the importance of JNF and how your donations can transform the lives of vulnerable Israelis, who are our extended family.

A Canadian psychiatrist who worked at the Herzog Medical Centre shared the following at the Dr. Max z'l and Gianna Glassman PTSD and Health Centre campaign launch event:

Rachel was a young mother living in Jerusalem. One evening, she and her husband went for a walk in the centre of the city when a terrifying explosion occurred. People darted in all directions. Rachel found herself separated from her husband and son and it took hours before they were able to be reunited.

In the aftermath of this attack, Rachel was unable to leave her home. She panicked when her husband took their son out to school or activities. Rachel and her family fell apart over the next number of weeks. Finally, they asked for help at the Herzog Medical Centre.

Thankfully, Rachel was able to receive treatment for her psychotrauma. During this period, it became clear that all three family members also needed help to move past the trauma. However, in order to be treated, the family had to visit three different dilapidated and depressing clinics scattered all over the city.

JNF Canada, in collaboration with the Herzog Medical Centre, decided to build a new and modern facility to house the variety of services needed to treat a diverse population, including children, adults, seniors, and those suffering from psychotrauma.

Thanks to the generosity of hundreds of Canadian donors from across Canada, JNF was able to bring the Glassman PTSD and Health Centre to realization. There is now a central location for mental health services in Jerusalem and the surrounding areas to allow medical professionals to treat 25% more patients in a state-of-the-art facility. Your support will transform the lives of thousands of people like Rachel.

Helping Holocaust survivors thrive in their golden years

Many of the nearly 200,000 Holocaust survivors living in Israel today were children during WW2, children who suffered an unimaginable tragedy. Over the past years, the number of survivors requesting support continues to grow. As the survivors age and face additional challenges, their needs grow and their support network becomes more limited.

This centre has become dilapidated and is unsuitable for many activities. Giving special needs students at the Dekalim High School **A Helping Hand**



Dekalim High School, in the underserved community of Be'er Sheva, provides creative and hands-on support for 110 high-school students diagnosed with severe learning disabilities. Focusing on life skills and preparing them for employment, Dekalim supports the development of students' cognitive, functional, emotional and social needs through hands on, applicable skills for their integration into the community.

The construction of the educational kitchen within the school will have a profound impact on the education they can provide – students now have the space and equipment to learn how to cook, clean and prepare food for themselves and others. Some students will also be able to translate those skills into employment in the food and hospitality industry. Thanks to the generosity of Sigmund & Linda Soudack, this project has been built and is now serving the students of the school.

Planting trees to attract The Bees at Plugot Forest!

For decades, JNF has been a steward of the environment, adapting to different challenges. Today, we know that bees are central to the functioning of our entire ecosystem. JNF is continuing in our timehonoured tradition by planting "bee-puller" trees in the Plugot Forest located in the northern Negev. This will strengthen the resilience of the forest and bee ecosystem.

Preserving Jewish Heritage at Ma'on

Caring for at-risk youth

The Green-Frieberg Social Services Complex at the Samson Israel Education Tennis Centre in Be'er Sheva will be a new, multi-purpose facility. The Social Service Complex will house an activity centre and social-support resources that will address the needs of children, teens, and young adults. It will house the Jarcaig Health and Wellness Clinic. The complex will be enhanced by the Al Osten Athletic Facility proving outdoor fitness and recreational opportunities. Be'er Sheva is rapidly expanding, yet it is economically challenged, so JNF Canada is focusing our efforts on this superb project in order to maximize the impact of the ITEC by doubling the number of at-risk children presently served in the current facilities.

SCHOOL SHOULD BESAFE

In the Eshkol region, located on the border of both Gaza and Egypt, children have seen their regional schools shut down countless times as rockets rained down from Gaza. Targeted by terrorists just a few kilometers away, these attacks bring life to a sudden stop and have long-term damaging effects. School closures leave children and parents isolated at home, and interrupt crucial childhood development, meaningful social interaction, and ongoing education.

Sound familiar? The pandemic has given us all a first-hand experience of what Israeli children have been experiencing for decades - the interruption of childhood in ways that none of us could have ever foreseen. But Israeli families must also deal with the ever-present danger of missiles falling in their community. As we approach the High Holidays, JNF Canada is determined to support the brave families of the Eshkol region with a Shelter for Safe Education: new fortified, educational, games-filled room to provide continued education and stability during times of crisis, when the regional school is closed. Kids can remain on their moshav and engage in study and play with peers, while their parents can continue to work or manage the affairs of the house while knowing their children are safe.

With this missile-proof facility, life can continue with as little disruption as possible. Its mere presence can lessen the psychological effects of being under ongoing fire, and reduce the mental burden shared by both parents and children.

CLIMATE SOLUTIONS PRZZE

It's easy to spot the effects of climate change these days. Just ask a Vancouverite about their summer heatwaves and wildfires, while Montrealers will confirm their winter seasons have been shorter and warmer over the years. Many in the JNF community have strong ties to Florida, where hurricanes are stronger and more deadly than ever recorded in history... Not convinced? Try Googling "Pacific Islands Climate Change".

The good news is we haven't yet reached the point of no return. Experts believe we still have a chance to reverse course, but the time for collective action cannot wait any longer. If there has ever been a time for Tikkun Olam repairing the world through human action – it's now.

And JNF is leading the way...

For decades, JNF has been a leader in environmentalism. Yes, we've planted 240 million trees in Israel. But we've also funded groundbreaking irrigation R&D in the Negev, restored desolate valleys back to their flourishing biodiversity, and closely collaborated with international environmental agencies to invent and deliver life-changing water and food security solutions to developing countries.

But it's not enough. The climate crisis is moving faster and we need solutions.

The Climate Solutions Prize, powered by JNF Canada, is our newest (and most innovative) environmental campaign yet. To help curb the climate crisis, JNF will award an annual prize of \$1 million to the most cutting-edge environmental solutions developed by nonprofit researchers and organizations. It's the first prize of this size in Israel - world-famous as the Start Up Nation, recipients' solutions could change the course of the climate crisis.



CSP is spearheaded by JNF Montreal, driven by the leadership of Executive Chair, Jeff Hart, Campaign Chair, Jonathan Goodman, supported by a distinguished group of prominent global advisors, and judged by world-class panel of judges.

Beyond funding climate solutions, CSP has also become a growing climate awareness campaign across Canada and Israel. In a recent three-part speaker series, CSP invited reknowned environmentalists to discuss what climate action looks like today (see sidebar for more info). CSP is collaborating with partners in Israel, including Start Up Nation Central, the Peres Center for Peace and Innovation, and KKL-Israel, to host a climate innovation festival, a Green Mission, awards ceremony, and more.

The Bervin JNF Canada House

The Jewish National Fund of Canada has always been at the forefront of cultivating the land of Israel, transforming its bleak deserts into beautiful blooming green forests and lush parks. Now, JNF Canada is also planting a different kind of seed.

The Bervin JNF Canada House in Sderot, the city closest to the Gaza border, will first and foremost serve as an after school, informal education, empowerment, and enrichment center for high school youth from Sderot and its surroundings. The youth in the region will be provided with the necessary tools and skills for academic success in science, technology, engineering, and math. The building will be fortified in order to protect students and staff from rocket and mortar attacks. It will also be fully accessible to people with disabilities.

Its design will be invitingly clean and bright. Large windows will let in natural light while colourful wall illustrations will enhance open spaces— creating an environment and ambiance unlike that of a school.

The Bervin, named by the son of Berdie and Irvin Cohen z'l of Winnipeg, aims to close the educational achievement gap, foster academic success, and empower the youth in the periphery. "It is thrilling for me to attach my parents' names to this unique project. I will love them forever and want Israel to exist and prosper forever."

"We believe that every child has the potential to achieve great things no matter where in Israel he or she was born, and that our role is to make the resources required for this available to them," said Avi Musan, KKL-JNF Houses Director. "The Bervin will be open to every teenager who wants to succeed, and we will provide them with all the assistance needed, so that they can develop their capabilities. This is a one-of-a-kind anchor that is unparalleled in the State of Israel."

Surrounded by a courtyard for outdoor studies, the Bervin will be comprised of learning spaces of different sizes, as well as relaxation areas equipped with a variety of educational and multimedia resources.

The space is intended to encourage creative learning based on the edutainment model of informal education. Further elements will include a unique experiential learning hub, a stateof-the-art computer lab, classrooms and meeting rooms, a multipurpose hall, a kitchenette, and an outdoor patio. JNF believes that education is the pathway towards reducing inequalities. The Bervin will provide Sderot's youth with the tools and experiences to compete with their peers from the centre of the country for the top programs in Israeli universities. For too long, Sderot's youth did not advance into the world of post-secondary education and it is our aim to ensure that these children who have experienced so much trauma living on Israel's most hostile border have every opportunity to succeed in their career path.

A note from our education emissary: Yifat Bear-Miller







Serving as JNF's educational emissary is not simply a job. Rather, it is a personal mission to which I am deeply dedicated. I am excited to engage all segments from our community in Israel education as I know that a connection to Israel and Zionism is foundational to a strong Jewish identity. Although we grappled with hybrid learning over the past 18 months, I am pleased that we were able to successfully use technology to reach Canadian children, youth, adults, and seniors from coast to coast with dynamic and compelling programming.

I was pleased to work with dozens of Jewish day schools, JCCs, youth groups, and more to celebrate the Jewish holidays, especially Tu Bi'Shevat, which is a highlight day for JNF. This would not be possible without the help of countless teachers, principals, and community professionals and I extend my gratitude to them for their partnership and cooperation. JNF is proud to provide these educational resources to schools and community organizations at no cost, as Israel education is a vital pillar of JNF's work across Canada.

Sadly, we had to cancel all of our missions to Israel, so I decided to organize dozens of free virtual tours of different sites across Israel during this past year which attracted well over 1,000 participants. As it was impossible for Canadians to visit Israel, we brought a taste of Israel to Canada. I focused on showing Israel off-the-beaten path so that participants could see the diversity of Israeli life. Due to the success of these

virtual tours, I will continue organizing them next year and I hope you will join me. However, when it is safe to travel to Israel again, I urge you to join a mission and see Israel the JNF way.

In partnership with the Toronto region, I was pleased to organize educational programming with the Jaffa Institutea non-profit, multi-service social agency that assists disadvantaged children and their families. Canadian students were sensitized to the plight of new immigrants by participating in activities surrounding JNF's Jaffa Daled project. Over 300 at-risk immigrant children ages 3-12 depend on the services of the Jaffa Institute's After-School Educational Enrichment Centers. The centre in Jaffa Daled was in dire need of upgraded playground facilities. JNF Canada revitalized the playground through our annual educational campaign. To engage our youth, students were asked to harness their creativity by designing a playground suitable for children who benefit from the programs offered by Jaffa Institute. This eye-opening initiative gave our students some insight into the lives of immigrant children and deepened their connection with peers in Israel.

I certainly hope that we will be able to return to "normal" during the upcoming academic year. I look forward to visiting classrooms and interacting with students face-to-face.

TREE CARDS OLIVE TREE

The olive tree, perhaps one of the most symbolic in Israel, represents blessings, health and rootedness. An olive branch serves as the emblem of the state of Israel, and as a symbol of peace universally. The tree itself is often gnarled and twisted with silver foliage, contributing to it's reputation of ancient wisdom. It grows wild and cultivated, producing green fruit in summer, which becomes purple-black by late autumn. Olives have been harvested for their fruit and oil as early as 4,000 BCE and were a major commodity in ancient trading.









TRIBUTE CARDS

Teddy Park is located adjacent to the walls of the Old City. It is a central meeting point between old and new Jerusalem, with thousands of locals and tourists passing through each year. The park includes a multitude of fascinating elements to attract visitors. JNF Canada brought new life to a historic building by adopting two of the most prestigious gates surrounding the park. This historic building represents a significant period in "modern" Jerusalem's history as it was built in one of the first neighbourhoods outside the Old City walls.
