

RESTORERS OF JERUSALEM



In our lifetime we have witnessed Jerusalem become the capital of the modern Jewish state and have had the privilege of witnessing the miracle of the reunification of the entire city. Since statehood, the Jewish National Fund, Israel's leading environmental organization, has continued protecting Israel's ecology and remains committed to sustainable development.

For centuries we were sustained by the prayer, "Next year in Jerusalem". The Jewish National Fund of Canada in partnership with the Jerusalem Foundation has allowed Canadians to have the unprecedented opportunity to link their name with Jerusalem, the city that embraces the spirit of the Jewish people, past, present and future.

The project encompassed the restoration and development of the old city walls of Jerusalem, expanding the possibilities of its utilization, and the development of an archeological activities garden and scenic promenade for the enjoyment of those visiting the ancient city, especially school children and the physically challenged.

The names of all "Restorers of Jerusalem" have been inscribed on a wall of honour located at the entrance to the Zion Gate. Those who assumed responsibility in restoring the ancient city walls will be linked to the City of Jerusalem and their names will be perpetuated for all time.

JOSH COOPER RECEIVES THE QUEEN'S DIAMOND JUBILEE MEDAL



On Sunday, March 3, 2013 Josh Cooper received the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal. Hon. Peter Kent, Minister of the Environment, made the following presentation:

"Many of you will remember Josh Cooper as a federal candidate for Thornhill in 2004. In 2005, he founded the Canadian Jewish Political Affairs Committee. CJPAC, as it is referred to, has a mandate to engage the Jewish community in the political process across Canada.

In 2009, Josh joined the Jewish National Fund (JNF) as Executive Director of Toronto. He went on to rebrand the century old institution and is now CEO of JNF Canada. Josh's career includes; Co-Founder of the Canada Coalition Against Terror; Co-Founder of Friends of America, three term President of Thornhill Nursery School, Hockey convener with City of Vaughan Hockey Association and Co-founder of Drive for Dreidels in 2003, a toy drive that has ensured that all 3,000 Jewish children in Toronto, living below the poverty line, receive a toy for Chanukah.

In receiving the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for service to his community and Canada, Josh Cooper is following in the footsteps of his grandfather Mike Lawrence who was a recipient of the Queen's Silver Jubilee Medal."

JNF WELCOMES A NEW SHLICHA

As a new shlicha, I had meetings with principals and directors of Jewish day schools, as well as directors of organizations whose mandate is to educate the community about Israel. On the JNF Canada Education Department's website, we have added pictures, videos and other programs highlighting what is being done in Israel and the changing geography of the land through the KKL/JNF projects. We hope to reach out to many educators and be the main resource for educators in this field.

Looking back at the month of Shevat, the Education Department worked with hundreds of children and students in various programs. We decorated flowerpots and planted flowers and vegetables, coloured the JNF's Blue Boxes and Tu Bi'Shevat colouring pages, created planters of old blue boxes learned about the many important reasons that KKL/JNF plants trees in Israel, and walked and played on a giant map of Israel. We participated in Tu Bi'Shevat community Seders and activities, including a very special Seder at the Baycrest nursing home in Toronto.

I was brought up in a household in which Zionism was always emphasized and where religious practices have been observed.


Having recently become a new dad, it is of paramount importance to set the very same example for my daughter and instill in her the very same values.

GALA 2013 HONOURING JACK BALABAN

JNF Calgary's Negev Gala, which takes place at Beth Tzedec Congregation this coming June 11th, will be a fun-filled basketball-themed evening featuring special guest speaker Dan Shulman - an award-winning and acclaimed ESPN sports commentator - and master of ceremonies Darryl Dawkins, nicknamed by the legendary Stevie Wonder as "Chocolate Thunder." Best known for his powerful dunks and as the first hoopster to shatter the backboard, the retired NBA star promises a slam dunk as emcee of a gala sure to please sports fans and JNF supporters.

Negev Gala honouree Jack Balaban, founder and director of Greengate Power Corporation, was instrumental in the deregulation of the natural gas industry in Canada. He served as director of the Independent Petroleum Association of Canada and of multiple public companies. The co-founder, president and CEO of Delek Resources Ltd. and of Delek Properties Ltd., he has proudly invested in emerging oil and gas centres.

A generous supporter of synagogues, Jewish day schools and numerous tzedakah initiatives in Calgary, Israel and Tanzania, Jack has also has a long and distinguished track record as a community, high school and JCC North American Maccabi Games basketball coach.

It is fitting that Jack and his family have chosen a project that brings together so many of his varied interests. The proceeds from Calgary's Negev Gala will support the development of The Balaban Basketball Park on the grounds of the Hesder Yeshiva in the northern Israeli city of Kiryat Shemona.

It is Jack's dream that the eponymous basketball facility be used by as many young people as possible - both within and beyond the Yeshiva - in keeping with his belief that youth sports build character while teaching invaluable life and leadership skills. The Yeshiva, which combines Torah study and service in IDF combat units, runs classes for youngsters in Kiryat Shemona, helping to build bridges between

The Balaban family is also working with the director of the Yeshiva to establish a basketball program and a tournament that will allow students to compete with local and national Israeli basketball teams.

The past year has been a true test of Jack's strength and character. After being diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in December 2011, he continues to fight a courageous battle.

Alexander also starred for eight months alongside Martin Short in the acclaimed production of Mel Brooks' *The Producers* where he was well received by critics and audiences alike.

When Alexander is not appearing as a character, he is often being asked to appear as some version of himself. He's been a frequent guest on every major daytime and late-night talk show. He has hosted *Saturday Night Live* and the *Emmy Awards*. He is most proud and most often commended for his several appearances with host Bill Maher on the HBO series *Real Time*, in which he has been an outspoken, articulate, insightful and satirical advocate for progressive issues.

He is also a prominent spokesman and representative for One Voice, a grassroots organization of Israelis and Palestinians committed to a peaceful, two-state solution in the Middle East. TU BI'SHEVAT FAMILY FESTIVAL AT THE WESTERN ARBORETUM

On Sunday, January 27th, an enthusiastic group of more than 30 children and adults met at Western University for a fun filled afternoon to celebrate Tu Bi' Shevat.

We participated in a guided nature walk on campus along the Medway Creek Trail that runs along the Thames River. Our tour guide, Professor Ben Rubin, Department of Biology, taught us how to identify different types of trees in the winter by observing their size and bark, touching and smelling the bark, and finding certain types of fungi and sap. We discovered where animals made homes, we learned about underground networks of roots, and we observed some of the unfortunate problems caused by the Emerald Ash Borers. We then visited the Arboretum, where the curator of the greenhouses showed us a variety of interesting plants and trees. Some were even native to Israel, such as olive, pomegranate and fig trees. Next, we gathered in a classroom where Dr. Rubin performed experiments demonstrating how trees survive in the winter. We witnessed how plants and trees extract water from the soil with their roots, how they keep minimal liquids in their cells to avoid freezing, as well as other mechanisms of protection from frigid temperatures that they implement.

We concluded our program with treats, hot chocolate and activities in the Einstein Cafeteria. We look forward to feeding birds from the bird feeders we crafted out of bagels, Crisco and bird seed.

This event could not have happened without our volunteers and parents, Adina and Stacey. Our festival was a success thanks to Dr. Rubin, who implemented our ideas into a very well planned and enjoyable program. This was Western University's first time running such a program, and we are honoured that they hosted JNF and enhanced our Tu Bi'Shevat experience.





Before the ancient Chinese sport was introduced to the country en masse, the average Israeli would not have been able to differentiate a dragon boat from a toboggan. Today, however, it's apparent that one of the world's fastest growing sports also ranks among Israel's most popular aquatic activities.

Aware that interest in dragon boating had reached a fever pitch in Montreal, JNF decided to capitalize on this "wave" of popularity, and recognized a novel way to mesh the community's curiosity for dragon boating with their love for Israel. The idea? To enter a JNF Montreal team in the 1st Annual Israeli Dragon Boat Festival on Lake Kinneret.

Aptly named the "JNF Blazing Paddles", the team successfully participated in the historic festival back in May 2012, (which

A perfect chord was struck as the dinner logistics co-chairs ensured a first-class cocktail reception preceded a gourmet meal served in an elegantly decorated ballroom.

Most importantly, thanks to the support of generous donors throughout the Montreal community, a state-of-the-art music conservatory will soon be constructed to benefit the people of the Arava who lack such resources as a result of their geographical isolation. The project will also help attract new residents to the region, and provide additional economic benefits to the Negev. Factoring in Micky's extensive personal ties to the Arava community (an auditorium and library already bearing the Rosenthal name), the decision to select this project was as easy as *do-re-mi*.

"I've been giving for more years than most people here have been alive," Micky dryly noted at the beginning of the evening. "The State of Israel is incredibly important to me. The Arava is a miracle; it's a result of unbelievable research and generous people who made it possible. We stand proudly with JNF at the forefront of it all, and never forget that the JNF is all of you!"

Micky took on this latest leadership role with the gusto and hard work that personifies his entire life. In addition, Micky has joined Montreal's Board of Directors and is also chairing the Cash Realization Committee.

2012 JNF MISSION TO ISRAEL & BERLIN



JNF missions transcend the limits of a standard tour and provide participants with a deeper connection to the land and the people with access to sites most tourists are unable to visit. This year's mission was no exception.

Our October Missions traditionally include the unique Jewish component of a European city, and 2012 brought JNF participants from across Canada first to Berlin and then on to Israel. Some of the sites visited in Berlin included the historic Jewish Quarter featuring Berlin's first synagogue, the Old Jewish Cemetery, the High School and the 19th century New Synagogue. Also seen was Platform 7 - the site of deportations, the infamous Wannsee Conference, Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp and the Jewish Museum, which documents 2000 years of German-Jewish history.

In Israel, visits included a special tour of "Operation Finale" which details the

capture of Eichman including fascinating documents released from the Mossad (guided especially for JNF by the curator of the exhibit). A unique and decadent "tasting" tour in Machane Yehuda that introduced everyone to the history, aromas and tastes of the traditional market. A tour of the Hula included bird banding and a wagon ride to view the thousands of birds on migration to Africa. A stop at a Research and Development centre allowed everyone to witness first hand the studies being done on developing agro-tourism and intensive greenhouse farming, producing better crops with minimal pesticides. Needless to say this proved to be both educational and sumptuous as tomatoes and peppers from the vines were sampled by all. A visit to a southern reservoir - one of 220 around the country - demonstrated how it helps paint the desert green and enables residents to make a living from agriculture.

A very emotional dedication of the "Restorers of Jerusalem" project took place with the Mayor of Jerusalem, Nir Barkat, and many other high profile guests. This JNF project restored and developed the old city walls from the Jaffa Gate to the Zion Gate. The names of those who donated and helped develop this meaningful project are inscribed on a commemorative wall on these historic ancient walls.

A visit to the Sederot police station demonstrated the incredible difficulties and trauma existing for residents in the South. A thrilling sunrise jeep tour in the Mitzpe Ramon Crater and a day with a former IDF Commander of the Northern Border were additional highlights.

Hi Everyone:

Well, the Sabbath is over along with our day of rest. The weather is still gorgeous in Tel Aviv - sunny, mild and dry. Up and out on the bus today at 8:30 on the road to Rehovot and the Weizman Institute and Science Park. It is named after Chaim Weizman, the first president of Israel. It is truly an amazingly huge complex of many buildings on 320 acres of land. Some of the Nobel Prize winners from Israel attended this institution.

After lunch we went to Sderot and saw a JNF reservoir and heard again about the importance of recycling water. To just let any water go down the drain is a concept they cannot accept and if they want to enlarge a settlement in the area, they have to pay for cleaning the water so they can accommodate additional people. And a



lot of that money comes from JNF. JNF is not just trees, they do so many more things for Israel, as for example paying to recycle a lot of the water.

Being in Sderot was very sad. From Sderot we could see Gaza and how Sderot is always being shelled during any battle. The sirens go off and the people have 15 seconds to run for cover. Each house has added on a bomb shelter room paid for by the municipality and the IDF. Many of the schools and building have added on rooms as well.

The one real highlight was that through JNF funds, an old textile factory was turned into a huge indoor playground for the kids who could not go out to play because of bombs. The facility is marvelous. There are basketball courts, a huge area for soccer, swings, toys, com-

puter rooms, a birthday room so kids could have birthday parties in there. Oh yes, there is a climbing wall but it couldn't be too high because if the 15 second siren went, they had to be down in that time to go into the shelter part.

The kids we saw looked so happy but can you imagine them living with those sirens?

TRANSITIONING FROM CHARITY TO PHILANTHROPY WHAT WILL YOUR LEGACY BE?

All those who receive this magazine have made a charitable donation to the Jewish National Fund. Some of us do it on a regular basis, by making an annual gift, some by responding to a request for donations for a special campaign, some by supporting a JNF sponsored event. Your charitable gifts take many forms. They can include donations of cash, securities, real estate, artwork, life insurance, annuities and even shares of privately held companies. Your motivation for giving is personal and through your gift to JNF you make a statement about who you are and your commitment to Israel.

However, philanthropy is more strategic than making a charitable donation. It is about establishing a long-term plan for giving, setting out the goals of an individual or a family and working to make that vision a reality. It should be a very personal plan that reflects the donor's convictions, beliefs and values. It involves a process of governance, monitoring and assessment and frequently requires a significant commitment from those involved to carry out the plan.

No matter why you give, your giving should be tailored to your unique circumstances. Individuals and families that engage in philanthropy have the opportunity to express their values and their charitable objectives in a structured form.

In recent years the tax rules regarding charitable giving have become increasingly flexible and generous and contain incentives to encourage Canadians to give to charity. When given appropriate consideration, charitable giving can benefit both the donor and JNF. You get a vehicle through which you can help this cause that you care about and Israel benefits as a whole. When considering making large gifts, contact your JNF office and they will connect you with professional tax and legal advisors to ensure you understand the various giving options available to you and their implications from a financial, estate and tax planning perspective.

Consider the charitable donations you made in the past to JNF. Could your interest in helping Israel develop into something more strategic? A critical element of this process is asking the right questions. Some individuals were raised in a culture of charitable giving and are familiar with many of its concepts. To others it is something new. It can be difficult to assess the impact that a large donation or an ongoing series of donations can have on personal resources, future income and family legacy. A comprehensive financial plan, developed with input from professional advisors, can help you see the effect that a gift, or a longer-term pattern of giving, will have on your financial picture. It may

assist you in determining the amount and timing of your gifts to ensure the optimal outcome. Again, JNF can assist you by introducing you to experts in a variety of fields related to charitable giving who can address all of your questions and concerns as there are many tax advantages to charitable giving.

We encourage everyone to create a philanthropic plan whether your are making an outright gift to JNF or supporting JNF through a private foundation or donor advised funds. Each of these vehicles have merit for one considering a philanthropic plan and should be explored in creating a strategy for your charitable giving.

Whether you are just setting out to build a structured plan for your giving, to allow your existing plan to evolve and grow or merely exploring the alternatives, the journey is likely to be challenging and highly rewarding.
